Get eye-to-eye with rhino in Ol Pejeta Conservancy, home to the world's last two northern white rhino and a refuge for endangered elephants and black rhino. Go off-road wildlife viewing and explore on foot in the Maasai Mara's Naboisho Conservancy. Finish your adventure in the legendary Maasai Mara atop the Talek River— a favorite crossing point for the great migration herds each year.

These conservancies are model partnerships between local landowners, tourism operators and researchers. Local communities are involved in wildlife conservation at each camp.

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DAYS 2-4

Saruni Rhino Camp

Sera Conservancy

In March of 2016, a female black rhino in the Sera Conservancy gave birth to a healthy calf, and made history. This is the first black rhino to be born on community conservancy land in northern Kenya for over 25 years. The calf also represents the community's hope that the Sanctuary can nurture a viable breeding population of black rhino, which could eventually help repopulate other community conservation areas.

The Sera Community Conservancy is a member of the Northern Rangelands Trust, an umbrella organization that supports 33 community conservancies across northern and coastal Kenya. Sera is governed by a democratically elected board and run by local people. It works to transform local livelihoods through conservation and

sustainable enterprises. Lewa Wildlife Conservancy, one of the largest black rhino sanctuaries in East Africa, provides logistical and technical support to these rangers, as well as supporting the overall security and monitoring in Sera.

At the Saruni Rhino Camp you'll search for rhino both in the Land Cruiser and on foot with community rangers to assist you.

DAYS 5-6

Kitich Forest Camp Mathews Mountain Range

With forested hills over a mile above sea level, Kenya's Mathews Range is a lush and temperate contrast to the parched safari savannahs. Located within a vast forest owned and managed by the local Samburu people, Kitich Forest Camp is a place to relax and wander. This small footprint camp-only six tented suites- combines luxurious comfort with an old-school safari experience. This is the place to get out of the car and explore the forest with Samburu trackers eager to share the natural details of their land. Brimming with stories, with expertise in everything from

medicinal plants to wildlife behavior and brimming with stories, the place is alive with birds and wildlife. The air is fresh and all the sounds nature. Known for elephants and hundreds of different mammals' birds and butterflies this is a true nature immersion.

DAYS 7, 8 & 9

Base Camp Eagle View Mara Naboisho Conservancy

Basecamp Eagle View sits in the private Mara Naboisho Conservancy in southwest Kenya and offers some of Kenya's best wildlife viewing year-round. Zebras and giraffes, attracted to nearby salt-licks, often stroll the grounds and in July and August, herds from the great migration journey through. The conservancy is a predator refuge with some of the highest concentrations of lions in the world. Star gaze the clear night sky.

Spend an afternoon at a Maasai village. Basecamp has close ties to the local community and the camp's staff and guides are locals who are happy to share their traditions and culture. Experiences here are authentic and unobtrusive.

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Maa Trust visit Maasai Mara, Kenya

Proceeds

from your visit go to the Maa Trust:

an independent non-profit in partnership with Maasai-owned conservancies and neighboring communities that works for conservation and to improve the lives of Maasai families through sustainable community development in the Maasai Mara ecosystem. The Trust manages projects that increase benefits to Maasai landowners of having wildlife on their land. These include schools, honey production, conservation education, beadwork, water and sanitation, health clinics and bursary programs.

Social enterprises, such as Maa Beadwork and Maa Honey, bring income and opportunity specifically to women, who felt that conservancy payments largely passed them over and went only to men.

Maa Honey runs 74 beehives, owned by 75 women in three women's groups. In 2015 Maa Trust relocated the hives inside the conservancy at secure ranger posts. With a donation from Africa Exchange for all of the equipment needed and a trained professional beekeeper, the women of this project bottle and decorate the jars of organic honey produced from their hives. The Maa Trust then sells this honey on their behalf to camps and lodges throughout the Mara.
