# Ololo Lodge Nairobi

Upon clearing customs at Jomo Kenyatta International Airport in Kenya's bustling capital city of Nairobi, a driver awaits you holding a Deeper Africa sign with your name on it. He will transport you to Ololo Lodge. Visit the Sheldrick Animal Orphanage and meet the resident baby elephants. Interact with the orphans and watch their inspiring keepers feed, nurture and rehabilitate them, so that they can form new families in the wild. Learn about conservation efforts in Kenya.

Enjoy lunch at Tamambo Restaurant before heading to the nearby Giraffe Center. Stand atop the platform to be

eye-level with these gentle giants. Hold out some pellets and feed lunch to a hungry giraffe.

Conclude the day with a tour of Kazuri Beads. Kazuri began as a tiny workshop making handmade beads and is now large enough to operate its own factory that produces beautiful handmade jewelry and pottery. See how the beads are made and turned into exquisite crafts.

# Serena Safari Lodge Amboseli National Park

Amboseli National Park's open savannah is famous for elephants. Researchers at the Amboseli Elephant Research Project have tracked these elephants for more than 40 years, given them names and mapped their family trees. Watch the herd's matriarchs, babies, teenagers and bulls interact and relate to one another.

Have fun learning animal identification, tracking and spotting skills from your safari guide. Supplement the guide's knowledge with extra information, maps and pictures at your fingertips.

The Enkongo Narok swamp and the acacia woodlands are always green and attract plenty of animals. The swamp's water is replenished underground from the snows of Mt. Kilimanjaro. Amboseli Serena Safari Lodge employs local Maasai from the surrounding area. Embark on a nature walk lead by a local Maasai guide.

# *BEADS for Education*

Isinya, Kenya

from your visit go to BEADS for Education

Depart Amboseli for a special day in the rural town of Isinya—home to the BEADS for Education program. This international non-profit supports Maasai mothers and their daughters by offering mothers the opportunity to sell traditional beaded crafts to pay for the school fees of their daughters. In places like Isinya, girls have been traditionally discouraged from pursuing education. Instead they have been married off, frequently to older men as a second, third or fourth wife. The program attracts international donors who sponsor students that

attend primary school, secondary school and college, if they choose. This program changes lives.

Spend time in class with Tembea Academy's BEADS Students and enjoy lunch. The children will have the opportunity to talk, laugh and share stories with their Kenyan peers.

# Sarova Lion Hill Lodge Lake Nakuru National Park

Lake Nakuru National Park contains a variety of ecosystems— acacia forest, woodlands and a famous soda lake that draws more than 400 species of birds.

Sarova Lion Hill Lodge offers marvelous views of pelicans fishing and flamingos wading.

Two endangered species thrive in Nakuru. In 1987, after devastation by poachers, just two black rhino remained in this park. The Kenyan Wildlife Service created a rhino sanctuary within the park and reintroduced breeding herds from nearby Laikipia, successfully reestablishing black and white rhino in the park. Similarly, the iconic Rothschild's giraffe, threatened in it's western Kenyan home, was introduced to the park in 1977. Now there are 60-70 members.

# Base Camp Eagle View

## Mara Naboisho

### Conservancy

Basecamp Eagle View sits in the private Mara Naboisho Conservancy in southwest Kenya and offers some of Kenya's best wildlife viewing year-round. Zebras and giraffes, attracted to nearby salt-licks, often stroll the grounds and in July and August, herds from the great migration journey through. The conservancy is a predator refuge with some of the highest concentrations of lions in the world. Star gaze the clear night sky.

Spend an afternoon at a Maasai village. Basecamp has close ties to the local community and the camp's staff and guides are locals who are happy to share their traditions and culture. Experiences here are authentic and unobtrusive.

# *Maa Trust visit*

Maasai Mara, Kenya

# Proceeds

from your visit go to the Maa Trust:

an independent non-profit in partnership with Maasai-owned conservancies and neighboring communities that works for conservation and to improve the lives of Maasai families through sustainable community development in the Maasai Mara ecosystem. The Trust manages projects that increase benefits to Maasai landowners of having wildlife on their land. These include schools, honey production, conservation education, beadwork, water and sanitation, health clinics and bursary programs.

Social enterprises, such as Maa Beadwork and Maa Honey, bring income and opportunity specifically to women, who felt that conservancy payments largely passed them over and went only to men.

Maa Honey runs 74 beehives, owned by 75 women in three women's groups. In 2015 Maa Trust relocated the hives inside the conservancy at secure ranger posts. With a donation from Africa Exchange for all of the equipment needed and a trained professional beekeeper, the women of this project bottle and decorate the jars of organic honey produced from their hives. The Maa Trust then sells this honey on their behalf to camps and lodges throughout the Mara.
