# DAYS 1-3 Arusha Serena Hotel Arusha National Park

Upon clearing customs at Kilimanjaro International Airport, a driver will greet you holding a Deeper Africa sign with your name on it. He'll transfer you to the Arusha Serena Hotel. Catch a glimpse of legendary Mt. Kilimanjaro along the way.

Nestled amid coffee plantations at the foot of Mt. Meru, the lovely Arusha Serena Hotel is built in traditional Tanzanian style on the shores of tranquil Lake Duluti.

Arusha National Park contains both savanna and forest ecosystems, many herd animals and interesting birds. Enjoy a picnic lunch and late afternoon canoe safari on Momela Lakes. Learn about the nearby Meru volcano explosion that created their alkaline environment.

## DAYS 4 & 5 Tarangire Treetops Tarangire National Park

Tarangire boasts one of the largest elephant populations in East Africa. Elephants eat between 220 and 440 pounds (100 to 200 kgs) of food a day, depending on their size, and the Tarangire River and southern wetlands provides ample water year-round to grow food for these huge creatures. Many close-knit elephant families matriarchs, babies, teenagers and bulls come together along the Tarangire River. Feel their wisdom and deep emotional bonds. Big cats love the rolling savanna too.

The river's marsh ecosystem attracts a large variety of wildlife and birds. Learn spotting and tracking skills

and have information and pictures at your fingertips as the Land Cruiser comes equipped with mammal & bird books. Your guide will point out where you've been and where you're going.

Tarangire Treetops is a unique camp offering accommodations in a treehouse, high in the baobabs.

## DAYS 6 & 7 Plantation Lodge Ngorongoro Conservation Area

Dry plains rapidly turn to lush coffee plantations and tropical vegetation on the drive from Tarangire to Ngorongoro Crater Conservation Area. Ngorongoro is an extinct volcano. The top (7,500 ft., 2,286 m.) boasts a once in a lifetime view into the caldera with some of the best wildlife viewing in East Africa.

Hike and visit with the Maasai in these ancient lands. Your Maasai guide, Sanguyan Kimani Ole Dorop ("Ole Dorop"), is a regional clan leader who has spent his whole life here on Mount Lemagut. The Maasai share these slopes with wildlife, having learned how to co-exist together. Meet Ole Dorop's family and learn about his village life and his proud and traditional culture. He'll share with you the cultural and political challenges facing traditional Maasai in the Conservation Area

Enjoy a chef-planned farm-to-table dinner at Plantation Lodge. Head into the Crater early as dawn brings a wave of activity into the natural world. This ecosystem showcases an astonishing microcosm of East African wildlife environments: grasslands, wetlands, acacia forest and soda lakes. Enjoy lunch at the Hippo Pools, where hippos and elephants wade for a midday bath.

After breakfast, head to the awe-inspiring Serengeti National Park. Enjoy a picnic lunch near Oldupai Gorge, site of the Leakey Digs excavation of some of the oldest human skeletons ever found.

Lemala Ewanjan offers great lion viewing and is located in the Seronera area of the central Serengeti—a 12,000 sq. mile (31,080 sq. km) savanna grassland spanning northern Tanzania and Kenya's Maasai Mara, forming one of the world's largest wildlife refuges. Visit the Singing Rocks—ancient painted stones that sound like bells when struck, that the Maasai used to talk to ancestors. Grab a rock and listen to the rock sing. Serengeti's famous annual wildlife migration stretches more than a thousand miles and is most known for vast herds of wildebeests, zebras and Thomson's gazelle. The herds gather on the Tanzanian side of the ecosystem from approximately November/December through early August. In search of greener grasses, they make their perennial pilgrimage from the Mara into the Serengeti and back. As the migration herds spill across the southern Serengeti out into the Conservation Area, witness the greatest wildlife show on the planet.

# One of the world's last cheetah strongholds.

Facing increasing pressure from humans and land encroachment, only 9,000 to 12,000 cheetahs are left in the African wild.

The Serengeti is generally considered the best place on earth to view cheetahs. Cheetahs do not live in prides and are solitary in nature. They tend to hunt alone, although occasionally brothers or a mother training her cubs hunt together. Many young cubs have been born the last few years. A mother usually has between 3 and 5 cubs. Only 2 to 3 of them reach maturity.

# Arusha Serena Hotel Flights & International Travel

After breakfast and wildlife viewing, take a late morning bush flight back to Arusha. Enjoy lunch at Arusha Coffee Lodge and visit the Shanga Project, a crafts cooperative that employs disabled Tanzanians, providing an opportunity to contribute economically to their families. These artisans handcraft high-quality items with recycled materials.

Tour the workshops with your family and chat with the local artisans. Join them to learn how they make these beautiful crafts. After dinner at the Arusha Serena Hotel, a Deeper Africa driver will transfer to Kilimanjaro International Airport for your departure.
