DAY 2 Arusha National Park

Arusha National Park contains both savanna and forest ecosystems, many herd animals and interesting birds. Enjoy a picnic lunch and late afternoon canoe safari on Momela Lakes. Learn about the nearby Meru volcano explosion that created their alkaline environment. Your wildlife viewing today can be as long as you like. You'll set your wildlife viewing schedule with your Deeper Africa guide to fit the pace most comfortable for your family.

There are elephants in the park and you may even have sightings of the rare black and white colobus monkey through the trees. While you're canoing you'll likely see hippos and flamingos wading in the waters. Buffaloes, elephants and other herd animals frequently move to the lakes to graze.

Tarangire Treetops Tarangire National Park

Get ready to enter a wilderness full of elephants as you wildlife view through Tarangire National Park on your way to Tarangire Tree Treetops. Tarangire is famous for elephants and hosts the largest and most conspicuous populations in East Africa. Between the Tarangire River and the southern wetlands, there is ample water year-round to grow food for these huge creatures. After all, elephants eat 220 to 440 pounds (110 to 200 kgs) a day, depending on their size.

You'll observe unique elephant behavior along the Tarangire River when many elephant families, as well

as numerous other species, gather together. Your Land Cruiser is equipped with a set of reference books so that when you identify a new animal, information and pictures are at your fingertips. You'll also have a full set of maps so that your guide can show you where you're going and where you've been.

DAY 5

Tarangire Treetops Tarangire National Park

Tarangire Treetops is an uncommon camp that allows your family to experience real life in the bush with comfortable and upscale accommodations in a tree house in the baobabs. In Tarangire you will never go along without seeing zebra, wildebeest, water buck, warthogs, giraffe, dik diks, Thompson's gazelle, buffalo, hartebeest, baboons, and vervet monkeys. The big cats, particularly lions and leopards love the large spaces and hidden places created by the rolling savanna. You typically do not see cheetah in Tarangire because the rolling hills do not allow them the speed they need to hunt their prey.

DAYS 6 & 7 Plantation Lodge Ngorongoro Conservation Area

Day 6: Dry plains rapidly turn to lush coffee plantations and tropical vegetation on the drive from Tarangire to Ngorongoro Crater Conservation Area. Ngorongoro is an extinct volcano. The top (7,500 ft., 2,286 m.) boasts a once in a lifetime view into the caldera with some of the best wildlife viewing in East Africa. Join your Deeper Africa guide for a walking tour of the lush coffee plantation at Plantation Lodge. Enjoy a chef-planned farm-to-table dinner at Plantation Lodge.

Day 7: Head into the Crater as early as dawn to experience the cloud forest that envelops the rim early in the morning. This ecosystem showcases an astonishing microcosm of East African wildlife environments: grasslands, wetlands, acacia forest and soda lakes. Enjoy lunch at the Hippo Pools, where hippos and elephants wade for a midday bath.

Wildlife viewing Coffee plantation hike The Crater is one of the few areas in Tanzania with rhinos, the most endangered animal on the continent.

Lemala Ewanjan Serengeti National Park

Hike and visit with the Maasai in these ancient lands. Your Maasai guide, Sanguyan Kimani Ole Dorop ("Ole Dorop"), is a regional clan leader who has spent his whole life here on Mount Lemagut. The Maasai share these slopes with wildlife, having learned how to co-exist together. Meet Ole Dorop's family and learn about his village life and his proud and traditional culture. He'll share with you the cultural and political challenges facing traditional Maasai in the Conservation Area. They're pastoralists so you will have the opportunity to meet the cattle and goats owned by the family as they come in from grazing and into the enclosures for safety at night.

DAYS 9-10 Lemala Ewanjan Serengeti National Park

Wildlife viewing Visit the Leakey digs

After breakfast, depart for the awe inspiring Serengeti National Park. Along the way, stop for a picnic lunch near Oldupai Gorge, site of the Leakey digs excavation. The Great Rift Valley is thought to be home to some of the first humans, and the Leakey family has successfully excavated some of the oldest humanoid skeletons ever discovered. View the first footprints of man in the on-site museum with the resident anthropologist.

Move next to the central Serengeti. You'll be wildlife viewing around the famous Seronera River. Seronera is actually a network of perennial rivers that merge into the valley, so there is water to be found year round. The river marks the boundary between the sweet grass plains of the southern Serengeti and the wooded hill of the north. That means there are plant, animal, and bird species from both difference habitats in this area. *Includes:* Breakfast Lunch Dinner Alcohol & Beverages Laundry WiFi

One of the world's last cheetah strongholds.

Facing increasing pressure from humans and land encroachment, only 6,517 to 7,000 cheetahs are left in the African wild.

The Serengeti is generally considered the best place on earth to view cheetahs. Cheetahs do not live in prides and are solitary in nature. They tend to hunt alone, although occasionally brothers or a mother training her cubs hunt together. Many young cubs have been born the last few years. A mother usually has between 3 and 5 cubs. Only 2 to 3 of them reach maturity.

Four Points Arusha Hotel Arusha

After breakfast and wildlife viewing, take a late morning bush flight back to Arusha. Enjoy lunch at Arusha Coffee Lodge and visit the Shanga Project, a crafts cooperative that employs disabled Tanzanians, providing an opportunity to contribute economically to their families. These artisans handcraft high-quality items with recycled materials.

Tour the workshops with your family and chat with the local artisans. Join them to learn how they make these beautiful crafts.
