

Follow the Okavango's water to the edge of the delta. This small, elegant camp is surrounded by open fields crossed by weaving bands of antelope eyed by lions and cheetah and leopards eyed by you—escorted by some of the country's most knowledgeable guides. Shinde Camp has one guide for four travelers. Expect bristling activity in this grassland ecosystem nourished by these life-giving waters. Tents overlook the water. So you can relax before dinner watching hippos sport and snort. After dinner, under the stars, gather around a blazing fire to compare notes and share stories.

Kanana Camp Kanana Concession Okavango Delta


This stop takes us deeper into the delta to understand the role of annual flooding that surges out of Angola's northern highlands to transform mudflats into a liquid world. Imagine a necklace of islands dotted with palms, figs, ebony and knobthorn trees. It's a huge nesting ground for herons, and pelicans are everywhere. Water life is the main attraction, but the surrounding riverine forest and plains may grant you a chance to watch a frolic of wild dogs. Again you'll have just four travelers matched with one guide. And there's a sleep-out deck where you can fall asleep listening to the sounds of this world.



Wildlife viewing Cultural tours Guided San bushwalk Here, the last trickle from the fingers of Okavango waters becomes the Boteti River to brighten the Makgadikgadi salt pans. It's a strong draw for large numbers of elephants, hippos, and zebra. Because the camp sits atop a rocky cliff you have a true birds eye view from your private veranda. Enjoy this armchair safari after an exciting day in the field, sipping a sundowner as elephants help each other shower off the day's dust. Or settle into the "hide," an inviting floating platform and sin a beverage there.



Genetic evidence suggests that the nomadic San (Bushmen) are one of the oldest peoples in the world.

Their lifestyle remains rooted in Paleolithic traditions, suited to the harshness of th dry season in the Pans and Kalahari. Take a leisurely bush walk with San trackers to see how people survive and thrive in this landscape, and learn basic survival skills and plant identification tips.

The San have their own variant of the Khoisan language with its clicking consonants and they will teach you a few basic words and phrases. Months from now, back in your busy life, you will remember the people you met on this day and be amazed to recall how their typical weekday looks and feels compared to yours. Some weeks, you may wish to trade places.



Travel for Impact

AGLOW-Pokolong is a Travel for Impact program that helps seniors in Maun. Government programs like Meals on Wheels don't exist here. But through this program, community members pitch in to help as needed with housekeeping and transportation and yes, delivery of hot meals. Daily visits keep clients connected to community news and doings and a monthly gift package delivers nutritional support, toiletries and other essentials.
