

# North Island Okavango Delta

Upon arrival at Maun International Airport in Botswana, a Deeper Africa representative will meet you holding a sign with your name on it. They'll transfer you to a bush flight into the Okavango Delta.

Touch down in a mosaic of small islands netted together with shining lagoons and transient channels. Explore the Okavango's land, water, and air. Some say this section of the Okavango has the highest concentration of lion, but the allure is in the diversity of species. It's famous for its large buffalo herds and the lions that hunt them. The plains hold a strong population of cheetah and wild dog, while the woodlands host leopard in high numbers. Lechwe leap through the water, and shy sitatunga can be viewed in the reeds. You can't dream up this kind of adventure.

# Tuludi Camp

## Okavango Delta

Khwai Private Reserve is 495,000 acres of Botswana's best kept secret. It features an exciting diversity of habitat – winding river channels, acacia woodlands and open savannas. Families of elephants move south to north with babies clinging to their mothers – each one wading single file into the water and climbing up the banks on the other side of the channel. Lion cubs play and climb trees on the savanna while waiting for their mothers. The savanna is also home to cheetah, active wild dog packs and leopards moving stealthily through the grasses. Superior guides, great wildlife, lovely food, and beautiful surroundings.

# Khwai Rangers

Be on the frontline with the rangers protecting the 494,000 acres (200,000 hectares) wilderness that makes up Khwai Private Reserve. You'll go out before dawn when the tracks are fresh and undisturbed. The rangers closely monitor the concession's predators and can use your help identifying individual predators and logging sightings. This important work assists in building a complete profile and history of a pride, a pack, or an individual animal. You'll spend 4 to 6 hours tracking wildlife, capturing data, patrolling the area as well as checking on conservation projects. Proceeds from your experience go back into conservation efforts in Khwai Private Reserve. These funds help to equip the ranger team with their surveillance and anti-poaching efforts on the concession, as well as aid with further research needed in the reserve.

# Tawana Camp

## Okavango Delta

Travel deeper into the oldest protected section of the Okavango into the iconic Moremi Game Reserve. The island was the traditional hunting ground for Botswanan Chief Moremi. Floods in this area are more regular and predictable than they are lower down in the Delta, creating what is commonly accepted as the best place in Botswana to view wildlife. It's known as Botswana's most diverse habitat, showcasing permanent lagoons, seasonal floodplains, drier savannas, woodlands, and acacia forests. Here the wilderness surrounds you each minute of the day.

Enjoy a back of the house environmental tour to see solar, water purification and recycling sectors of this environmentally responsible camp.

# Elephant Haven

Elephant Haven is Botswana's only elephant orphanage.

Without a mother's care, a baby elephant cannot survive alone in the wild. Elephant Haven gives these babies a chance to survive, thrive, and rediscover familial bonds that are so important to elephants as a species. By partnering with villagers from all around the Okavango, the orphanage, which opened in 2017, has eyes and ears far and wide. Their first two weeks are the most crucial, as their handlers must get these little ones to trust them, treat any illnesses or injuries, and teach them to feed from a bottle to get the nutrition they need.

Every elephant has a 20-year commitment from Elephant Haven. Currently the elephants at the orphanage are ages 6-months to around 4 years old. They are cared for 24 hours a day by dedicated handlers, and the youngest babies are fed bottles of formula every 3 hours around the clock. When they are becoming more independent, the elephants are moved from the boma area to a 1,000-acre soft release area just four miles down the road. Here they have no human contact, but an electric fence keeps them safe from predators and from following other wild herds away from their safe space. At about age 5 the elephants will be collared and then moved out to live the rest of their life wild.

Depart from Tawana Camp by helicopter for a short flight into the wilderness around Elephant Haven. Return by helicopter.

# Travel for Impact

AGLOW-Pokolong is a Travel for Impact program that helps seniors in Maun. Government programs like Meals on Wheels don't exist here. But through this program, community members pitch in to help as needed with housekeeping and transportation and yes, delivery of hot meals. Daily visits keep clients connected to community news and doings and a monthly gift package delivers nutritional support, toiletries and other essentials. Travel for Impact is one of many Nongovernmental Organizations (NGOs) we work with. Your Deeper Africa trip includes a contribution to Travel for Impact. If you'd like to do more, you can bring along a few pieces of warm winter clothing to donate. If you'd like to do more, you can bring along new or gently used adult winter hats, gloves, and scarves. It gets cold in Botswana.
