DAY 1

Arusha Coffee Lodge Arusha


Upon clearing customs at Kilimanjaro International Airport, your Deeper Africa guide will greet you holding a sign with your name on it. On the drive to Arusha, if the weather is right, you may catch a glimpse of the legendary Mount Kilimanjaro.



DAYS 2 & 3

Manyara Tree Lodge Lake Manyara National Park

Drive out with your Deeper Africa guide for Lake Manyara National Park, set against the Rift Valley and boasting over 380 recorded bird species as well as rare tree-climbing lions. This ecosystem showcases an astonishing microcosm of East African wildlife environments: including acacia woodland, grasslands, swamp delta and an expansive soda lake. Most unusual is the evergreen groundwater forests set against the Rift Valley escarpment. While it looks like a rainforest, there is actually very little rainfall here. Instead, mineral springs seep up through porous volcanic soil.




DAYS 4, 5 & 6

Mpingo Ridge Tarangire National Park

Head south into the wild of Tarangire National Park, home to one of the largest elephant populations in East Africa. Many close-knit elephant families— matriarchs, babies, teenagers and bulls, come together along the Tarangire River. Feel their deep emotional bonds. Big cats love the rolling savanna here too.

Remote Mpingo Ridge is in an unspoiled wilderness far from other lodges and camps. Close to the stunning, rarely visited Silale Swamps, the area hosts both lesser and greater kudu—seldom seen in the rest of northern Tanzania. Incredibly diverse habitats, not seen anywhere else on the northern circuit, range from grassland and woods in the north to low hills, scrub and wetlands in the south. Southern Tarangire, a birder's paradise, hosts 550 recorded bird species.

At the end of the day, enjoy a wonderful safari tradition: sundowners (drinks at sundown). Being so close to the equator, sunsets are quick and brilliant. The dark silhouettes of towering, ancient baobab trees come alive against the background of the fiery African sky.



DAYS 7, 8 & 9

Campi ya Kanzi Chyulu Hills

Campi ya Kanzi is part of a unique partnership with the Maasai tribal council of the Kuku Group Ranch—280,000 acres of land in the Chyulu Hills. The Maasai have participated in all stages of the camp's development including construction and operations management. The camp, built with local materials, organically grows vegetables and recycles water through lava filters to supply a waterhole for wildlife.

Chyulu Hills, Kenya

The forests of the Chyulus are part of a large-scale forest protection project with REDD+. The program allows the Chyulu forests to sell carbon credits on the new voluntary carbon market. The carbon revenues are invested in local infrastructure. So far they have paid for new forest ranger stations, seven new schoolteachers, improved school buildings and water catchments, trained rangers on biodiversity and conservation management and purchased new monitoring equipment. 150 children have had the entirety of their secondary schooling covered by carbon finance. More than 11,00 tree seedlings have been planted across the Chyulus, in addition to the trees that have been saved from logging and land conversion.



DAYS 10, 11, 12 & 13

Naibor Camp Maasai Mara Game Reserve

One of Africa's most legendary parks, the Maasai Mara is in the northernmost triangle of the Serengeti ecosystem. Extending more than five thousand square miles south into Tanzania, it's one of the world's largest wildlife refuges. During the annual great wildebeest migration, an estimated 1.8 million animals follow seasonal rains into the Mara from Tanzania and back, migrating as many as 300 miles per year.

Naibor Camp offers the closest possible vantage point to see the herds thunder across the waters as they make their way north every August through October. River crossings are treacherous with perilous obstacles—swift currents, steep banks and hungry crocodiles.



In the Maasai language, the word Serengeti means 'endless plain'.
