

DAY 2

Stone Town Tour

Stone Town is a UNESCO World Heritage site, and the seat of Zanzibari and Swahili civilization. Zanzibar was once nestled in the middle of an ancient mercantile civilization that included independent coastal and island city states stretching from the Somali coast to the Zambezi river. For centuries merchant vessels arrived from India, Arabia, Persia, China, Japan, and Russia. Coastal Africans fused their traditions with Arab customs until the "Swahili" became a distinct race with their own language, cuisine, rulers, art, and decoration.

Your Deeper Africa guide will take you on a morning walking tour of Stone Town. Stone Town is a magical labyrinth of narrow twisting streets and bustling bazaars. Bazaar stalls and street vendors can be found in all but the quietest spots. There are fresh vegetables for sale, baskets of tropical fruits, and an amazing seafood market with some exotic catches. The houses are whitewashed stucco rising up unevenly three to four stories above the street. Lights and shadows dance across the alleys.


Afternoon free to explore Stone Town. Dine on the roof of Emerson on Hurumzi. Enjoy a Zanzibari dinner and learn about island traditions





Kisiwa on the Beach Paje Beach

Paje Beach on Zanzibar's barrier reef protected east coast, is famous for its beautiful white sand beaches and tropical marine life in its coral reefs, rocks and shipwrecks. It offers excellent diving and snorkeling. The dramatically low tides expose small lagoons

Leaving from the Fumba dock, head out on a traditional wooden dhow towards your first snorkel stop. On the way you will hopefully meet dolphins, playing around in the shallow Marine Park of Menai Bay. The reefs surrounding the sand bank are your second snorkeling trip; the underwater world will seem very different compared to your first stop. Enjoy the short trip with your boat towards your final stop where you reach the beautiful island Kwale, and the Safari Blue crew will be waiting for you. Depending on the tides you may stop in a very special place, where the boats take you into the world of an island full of mangroves for a swim. The tidal lagoon has centuries of history stored in its coral. It's a different swimming experience with warm waters and a stunning location for photographs.






Experience the heart of Zanzibar's culture through 1000 Hands. This immersive excursion for the day takes you to the nearby village of Makunduchi, where local artisans demonstrate traditional crafts like coconut rope-making and seaweed farming. You'll see the whole process; how rope is made from coconut husks and then used to make boats, beds and chairs.

Next visit the Seaweed Centre in Paje and see how seaweed is planted, grown and manufactured into oils and soaps. Explore the rich heritage of the community, witness daily life in Zanzibar, and gain a deeper appreciation for the craftsmanship and traditions passed down through generations.
