DAYS 1, 2 & 3

Tau Pan Central Kalahari Game Reserve

“Tau” means lion in Setswana. The camp is named for the iconic black-maned lions that make their home here. Meticulously furnished cottages sitting atop the ridge of an ancient sand dune, with a fireplace centered on a sweeping deck that overlooks the waterhole and the plains beyond. In this remote corner of the Kalahari desert, star-gazing is superb. The rain brings lush vegetation to this interdune valley attracting thousands of migrating springbok and gemsbok. Land Cruiser safaris here equip you with an accomplished guide and a skilled tracker. Together they make sure you never miss a thing and that you understand the rich mosaic of life on this Kalahari land.

DAYS 4, 5 & 6

Kwara Camp Okavango Delta

Now move to a water world in the Okavango. Enjoy a dugout canoe plying serpentine bends of open water—cobalt blue under morning sun. You’re watching wading elephants open channels through a raft of reeds when a herd of zebra or lechwe bound through the shallows kicking up plumes of spray. The Okavango Delta ecosystem seen from the air is a glittering hand that reaches deep into Botswana, the lifeblood stitching these wild lands together. Time spent here proves unforgettable.

DAYS 7, 8 & 9

Camp Kalahari Makgadikgadi Pans National Park

Once the rains start zebra begin migrating from the north, moving south into the salt pans, some traversing over 600 miles (1000 kms) making this Africa's longest wildlife migration. Humans have made this migration difficult by building roads and fences, but the zebra's annual journey is a testament to their genetically programmed instinct to migrate. The flood plains sprout fresh grass convincing the zebras it is time to birth their calves. Welcome to Botswana's zebra birthing season. The rain also brings you into the largest flamingo breeding grounds on the continent, where pink wings fill the sky.

Mums, Babies and the Future of Elephants

Mummy's Angels lends a helping hand to mums and their newborns in Maun, Botswana, gateway to the Okavango Delta and its charismatic creatures.

Women should lead conservation in Africa, says Ellen Sirleaf the former president of Liberia. We agree. The survival of Africa's protected areas and wildlife is in the hands of Africa's next generation, and the next generation is in the hands of Africa's mums.

Rural women living near wildlife reserves labor as gardeners, market sellers, water carriers, fuel gatherers, cooks, shopkeepers, wives, mothers and village advisors—with little if any income.

Mummy's Angels is where small gifts make a big difference. Mums leaving Maun hospitals with newborns receive care packages packed with essentials to give their newborn a comfortable start in life. Each care package is packed with diapers, baby clothes, toys and other gifts, along with pajamas and slippers for the mum. For each item donated by travelers Kwara Camp matches the cash value of the item donated – doubling the impact. A connection is forged between travelers and host communities while lending cheer to a new start in life.



Travel for Impact

BanaBa Letsati is a grass roots program that brings community members together to expand opportunities for school-age children in Maun. It's run by Travel for Impact, one of many Non-governmental Organizations (NGOs) we partner within Africa. Your Deeper Africa safari includes a contribution that keeps this program running and growing. This means boosting recreational opportunities, providing counseling and peer mentorship. It means extra clothes and shoes for active growing kids. BanaBa Letsati is a place to learn new skills, to get some help with schoolwork, or just relax over a shared meal.
