DAY 1

Hamerkop House Arusha



Upon clearing customs at Kilimanjaro International Airport, your guide will greet you holding a Deeper Africa sign with your name on it. On the drive to Arusha, if the weather is right, you may catch a glimpse of the legendary Mount Kilimanjaro.

DAYS 2 & 3

Olkeri Camp Tarangire National Park

After breakfast, drive into the wild of Tarangire National Park. Search for wildlife, have a picnic lunch and head toward Olkeri Camp in the unspoiled wilderness far from other lodges or camps.

Tarangire boasts one of the largest and most conspicuous elephant populations in East Africa. Observe their unique behavior along the Tarangire River and the Silale

Wetlands where many close-knit elephant families come together. The big cats, particularly lions and leopards love the rolling savanna here as well.

At the end of the day, enjoy a wonderful safari tradition: sundowners (drinks at sundown). Being so close to the equator, sunsets are quick and brilliant.

Dry plains rapidly turn to lush coffee plantations and tropical vegetation on the drive from Tarangire to Ngorongoro Crater as Conservation Area. Arrive at Plantation Lodge, a peaceful retreat with its own organic vegetable and coffee farm, overlooking the Great Rift Valley and Ngorongoro Forest. Try farm-to-table, Tanzanian style.

Head into the Crater early as dawn bringing a wave of activity in the natural world. Welcome to an astonishing

microcosm of East African wildlife environments: grasslands, wetlands, acacia forest and a soda lake. At the right time of day, flocks of flamingoes wade into the soda lake to feed. Zebra, wildebeest, giraffe and gazelle mingle on the savanna and buffaloes graze in the long grass. It's not uncommon to see lions and possibly a first cheetah sighting in the Crater, on this "mini" savanna.

DAYS 6 & 7

Lemala Ndutu Tented Camp Serengeti National Park

Moving west, enter the land of the famous migration. Enjoy a picnic lunch near Oldupai Gorge, site of the Leakey digs excavation of some of the oldest human skeletons ever found. Visit the museum and learn about the gorge from the resident anthropologist.

In late-January, February and early-March millions of wildebeest, zebras, gazelles and impala gather in the Serengeti's remote southern plains. Suddenly, this vast wild land, lonely so much of the year, explodes with new life's energy.

African ungulates are remarkably savvy about nutrition. They know that in these months the southern Serengeti's grass is rich in the minerals needed for healthy moms and frisky babies. There is danger though. Lions, cheetah and hyenas are lurking in the tall grass. So zebras go in first. Zebras can dispatch predators with powerful kicks while chomping the grass until it's as short as golf course lawn. Once the grass is mowed, the open plains are protected from sneaky predators. It's then that a million and more wildebeest move in. Soon the plains are jumping with baby zebras, baby wildebeest and baby antelopes.

DAYS 8 & 9

Nanyukie Lodge Serengeti National Park

The word *Serengeti* comes from the Maasai language and means “endless plain.”

Set off in the Land Cruiser with your guide for the eastern Serengeti and the Namiri Plains. This section of the Serengeti has been closed to the world for more than 20 years. The Frankfurt Zoological Society has been tending this area, working to create a safe haven for cheetah. The Ngare Nanyukie underground river creates pockets of permanent water that supports year round concentrations of wildlife. That means easy prey available throughout the year. Frankfurt has built

on that permanent water source and their efforts have not only significantly increased habitat for cheetah, but for all predators. This is big cat country with the highest density of cheetah in East Africa, who fly across the plains in pursuit of prey. Leopards hunt beyond the sight of human eyes and lions rule the grasslands. The little cats, including caracals, servals, and African wild cats, also make their presence known.

Enjoy lunch at Arusha Coffee Lodge and visit the Shanga Project, a crafts cooperative that employs disabled Tanzanians as artisans and craftmakers. Using recycled materials to make high quality items provides these artists an opportunity to contribute economically to their families.

Shop or sightsee for the rest of the afternoon in Arusha. Repack, shower and relax in a day room at Arusha Coffee Lodge. A Deeper Africa driver will take you to Kilimanjaro International Airport for your departure flight.
