DAY 2

Cape Town Eats Tour

So much about a country and a culture is expressed through its cuisine – and in South Africa, food offers the ultimate glimpse into its cultural diversity and curious eccentricities. Here, much of the cuisine is home cuisine. Today you'll join one of Cape Town's "foodies" for a voyage into the heart of South African heritage through its food. This is a walking tour that starts at 8:30 am and ends at 3:30 pm. Stops for food and drink tastings are chosen because they are the favorite places of your guide or because you have a special interest. So, speak up. Possible stops.

DAY 3

Gardens to Grapes Tour

We'll pick you up this morning for the drive to the Kirstenbosch Gardens to enjoy the Cape Floral Kingdom, one of the richest floral regions in the world. Once there you'll hike with your guide through the Boomslang Tree Canopy walkway which winds from the forest floor into and through the trees until it bursts out above the canopy offering views of Table Mountain, Cape Flats, and most of the Gardens. We'll then hike up the lower slopes of Table Mountain using the Contour Path in Kirstenbosch Gardens. Fantastic panoramic vistas across False Bay while hiking. Once you reach Constantia Nek you'll meet up with your vehicle and driver. We'll pick a Constantia wine estate for lunch. Enjoy the sweeping views of the Constantia Valley and stop for wine tasting at two estates.



DAYS 4, 5 & 6

Ivory Lodge Sabi Sands, Kruger Lion Sands

On the banks of a beautiful river where Sabi Sands meets Kruger lies one of the great unspoiled wilderness areas in South Africa. In addition to the river there are many deep waterholes, offering great wildlife sighting opportunities. The unfenced border with Kruger allows for impressive species densities. Each day brings deepening appreciation as your senses come alive and your curiosity is rewarded with sharper observations and new insights. All the while you enjoy comfort and service that make you feel at home and at ease in this wild land.

DAYS 8, 9 & 10

EcCa Lodge Kwandwe Private Game Reserve

Kwandwe will pick you up his morning to transfer you out to the Game Reserve.

Kwandwe Reserve holds 74,000 acres (30,000 hectares) and it is a biodiversity hotspot in the Eastern Cape. Expect sightings of both black and white rhino because the reserve holds the third most important population of black rhino in Africa, and lots of white rhino. Deeper Africa travelers participate in a rhino conservation experience as part of a team that is darting, notching, administering medications and measurements, and changing out computer chips on the rhino's ankle bracelet, all under the supervision of Kwandwe's veterinarian. This is a once in a lifetime experience.

DAY 9

Rhino Conservation

The population of both black and white rhinos is plummeting across the continent, driven by the value of rhino horn in Vietnam and China. Black rhinos are listed as critically endangered, and white rhinos as near threatened. Since 2010, Kwandwe has darted and notched 33 black rhinos and 78 white rhinos. A significant portion of the planet's black and white rhinos live in Kwandwe and the neighboring Great Fish River Reserve. Kwandwe supports anti-poaching programs in both reserves. Anti-poaching teams, made up of rangers, scouts, and dogs, risk their lives tracking and confronting poachers. Thousands of animals, including lions, black and white rhinos, buffalo, elephants, and cheetahs, roam these expansive plains.

Today, you'll be working alongside Kwandwe's veterinarian and ranger team to dart and bring down one of Kwandwe's rhinos so it can either be ear notched for identification or fitted with a state-of-the-art solar-powered ankle collar that provides information to the conservation team on the movement, stress levels, and behavior of this rhino. The ankle collars allow Kwandwe to utilize sophisticated drone and AI technology to help the rangers protect their rhino. What an incredible day.



DAY 8

Spekbomm Conservation

Have lunch with Craig Sholto-Douglas, a leading conservationist in South Africa and the Environmental Manager at Kwandwe. Craig will share backstage insights about Kwandwe's environmental efforts.

Experience the pioneering landscape-level carbon restoration project in this biome's Albany thicket. Rhino habitat in the Eastern Cape's Albany thicket contains spekboom, a carbon capture plant. Rhinos love to live in Albany thicket which is why they prosper here. Currently the spekboom on the reserve stores 520,000 tons of carbon. Meet the workers who have planted 3.4 million spekboom trees across 3,000 acres (1214 hectares). Kwandwe's goal? To restore 10,000 acres (4,050 hectares) of spekboom into more Albany thicket habitat. Spekboom is ten times more effective at carbon capture than any tropical rainforest. With over 32,123 acres (13,000 hectares) of thicket, Kwandwe conserves around 520,000 tons of carbon on the property, playing a crucial role in combating climate change and supporting biodiversity.



DAY 11
