
DAY-BY-DAY ITINERARY

From Cape Town City venture into the wilds at Sabi Sand Reserve. Your stay at Duluni River Lodge is a wildlife immersion. From wild dogs racing the grasslands, to leopards lazing in trees, to elephants splashing and playing along the river, the enchantments seem endless.







One Kensington Hotel Cape Town

Meet a representative of Colossal plane side once your flight lands at the Cape Town Airport. Collossal will assist you through the Cape Town Airport. They'll help you through customs and immigration, pick up your luggage, visit the currency exchange and connect you up with your Deeper Africa driver. Then your driver will transport you to One Kensington Hotel.



Morning: Begin the day with a tour of Table Mountain to soak up the panoramic vistas of the Mother City and the surrounding oceans. Wander through the Company's Garden and visit the South African Museum, before venturing to the Castle of Good Hope. Built by the Dutch East India Company, between 1666 and 1679, as a maritime replenishment station, the Castle is the oldest surviving colonial building in the country.

During the tour through the city, you'll pass the Houses of Parliament, the Grand Parade and City Hall, where Nelson Mandela first addressed South Africans after his release from prison. You'll pass through lots of different neighborhoods and learn a lot about Capetonians. We'll drop you at the Victoria & Albert Waterfront. Pay cable car directly: 430 Rand per person, Fast Track Ticket: 995 Rand per person.

Afternoon: Get yourself to the Bo-Kaap Museum by 2 in the afternoon, 71 Wale Street, to meet your Bo-Kaap guide for a walking tour of the Bo-Kaap neighborhood. (Ubers work great in Cape Town). The neighborhood is the oldest and most historic residential area in South Africa with origins dating back to the Dutch colonists who brought with them slaves from Indonesia, Malaysia, India, and Africa. It is this mix of cultures that results in the unique and incomparable Bo-Kaap culture, customs, and cuisines. The architecture is typical of that time with cobblestone streets and pastel-colored houses.

By joining the Bo-Kaap tour you are directly contributing to projects that impact and support impoverished communities, living on the periphery of the city centre.



One Kensington Hotel Cape Town

Morning: The best part of travel is touching other people from different cultures and understanding that even though we are so different, we share many similarities. This morning you'll be with a Uthando community guide who will take you by vehicle into the Cape Flats township to visit three community development projects run by Uthando. The tours offer an introduction to the social problems confronting millions of South Africans, while showing us the innovative and inspirational ways the community handles their challenges. A third of the labor force in South Africa is unemployed in large part due to the failure of public schooling. The morning is meant to educate, inform and inspire, while also respecting the dignity and privacy of the people you are visiting.

Lunch: On your own, pay direct. We'll make suggestions for lunch restaurants.

Afternoon: This intriguing excursion begins at the Clock Tower at the Victoria & Alfred Waterfront. Depart by ferry to Robben Island which was a training and defense station in World War II. It is well known as a place of banishment, isolation, and imprisonment, becoming world famous as the prison Nelson Mandela was held for 18 years. Once you arrive on the island, you'll be met by a local South African guide who spent time here as a prisoner during the Apartheid years. He'll have a personal and moving account of his time as a prisoner You can stand in the cell where Nelson Mandela spent a large part of his life.

Dulini River Lodge Sabi Sands Reserve

Great wildlife and exceptional guiding are the hallmarks of Duluni, a sector of Sabi Sand Reserve with open borders into the Kruger National Park. The perennial Sand River runs through the reserve bringing lifesaving water to the Lowveld, as well as beautiful riverine landscapes. It is an area famous for the wide diversity of wildlife including the Big Five: lion, leopard, elephant, rhino and buffalo.

Lots of big cat sightings including leopard, plus an additional predator – wild dogs. Duluni guides are very familiar with the wildlife in the reserve and their interpretive skills are excellent. They track their lions and leopards on a daily basis, so sightings are frequent. These guys are superb. Plus the water and reed beds of the Sabi River are a major draw for birds, hippo, and the possibility for a sighting of the rare sitatunga semi-aquatic antelope. Land Cruisers limited to six travelers with a private guide and tracker.

Wildlife Viewing Walking Safari

Peech Hotel Johannesburg

Morning transfer from camp to Kruger Mpumalanga Airport for your flight to Johannesburg.



Peech Hotel Johannesburg

Journey today to Soweto to experience a two-hour eco-friendly bicycling adventure around the township, getting to know the different communities and its history. Your cycle route will take you past places such as a former migrant workers' hostel for men - before you continue to Meadowlands - famous for the forced removals from Sophiatown in the 1950's.

Cycle through historical landmarks of the 1976 student uprisings and visit the memorial site of Hector Pieterson. Cycle down Vilakazi Street where Nelson Mandela used to live and where Bishop Desmond Tutu had his home. Lunch is included at Lebo's for a delicious traditional African stew, cooked over a fire and served with a chunk of white bread - a Sowetan 'bunny chow' before you continue to Constitution Hill.


More than any other site in South Africa Constitutional Hill encapsulates the oppression of the country's past together with its hopes for the future. During your afternoon tour visit the Old Fort Prison with an impressive view from its ramparts and a visit to Nelson Mandela's prison cell, as well as the prison cell of Gandhi, a view of the Women's Jail and the Men's Jail, known as Number 4. Your time at Constitution Hill finishes with a visit to the fully operational Constitutional Court itself.



Peech Hotel Cradle of Humankind

Morning pickup by a Deeper Africa guide for the journey northwest out of Johannesburg. Your first stop in the Cradle of Humankind World Heritage Site is the Malapa Fossil Cave, the site of the discovery of an extraordinary hominid fossil named Australopithecus sediba. The skeletons found here are the most complete remains ever found of any hominid dating to around 2 million years ago. This is an active dig site. Your guide is an expert in geology, paleoanthropology, history, as well as a good storyteller about the history of humankind region. Your guide operates the only guided tour to this two famous dig sites. The discoveries from the Rising Star Cave and Malapa are rated by Smithsonian Magazine in the top ten scientific breakthroughs in the last decade.

As you move about the site, you'll have the opportunity to view high-altitude grasslands which are second only to the Cape Floral Kingdom in terms of floral diversity. There are wildlife in the grasslands including eland, kudu, blesbok, blue wildebeest, and hartebeest. Finish off with a late lunch at the Cradle Boutique Hotel, pay direct.
